

Assistance by the Numbers



Need in Northern New Mexico

Most of our clients fall into one or more of the following categories:

- Families facing an unexpected emergency (medical or funeral expenses, car repair, loss of a job, etc)
- Victims of domestic violence
- People with disabilities
- Undocumented people or DACA recipients
- Single parents or grandparents raising children on limited incomes
- People seeking behavioral health treatment

Families we work with often face obstacles on multiple fronts, carrying a load that is unimaginable to many. Self Help gives clients the help they need to overcome these obstacles; we believe no one should be homeless, cold, or without basic needs such as food and clothing. By connecting clients with emergency assistance and referrals for jobs, housing, and social services, we form a bridge to future self-reliance.

Organizational Update

This is an exciting time at Self Help—we're almost to our 50th anniversary, and in 2018 we completed our first Executive Director transition since 2000! Ellen Morris Bond retired after 19 dedicated years of service, handing the reins to Maura Taylor, a Los Alamos native with a background in community nonprofit work and financial services. Through generous community support, we were able to complete the transition with no impact to client services. We also hired Self Help's first Program Assistant, with the intention of expanding outreach efforts while maintaining our high standard of client service. As Los Alamos County's Salvation Army outpost, we raised funds to fund our basic needs assistance in Los Alamos County, and will be able to beef up our reserves for disaster response. Our volunteers lent a hand, logging over 800 hours. In the works: plans for a satellite office in Española, expanding our board, and a 50th birthday party in April. Thank you for helping us help so many New Mexicans this vear!
