- Direct help, real relief



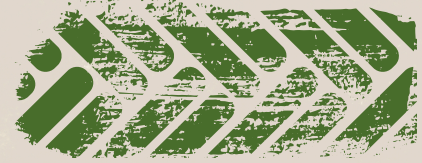

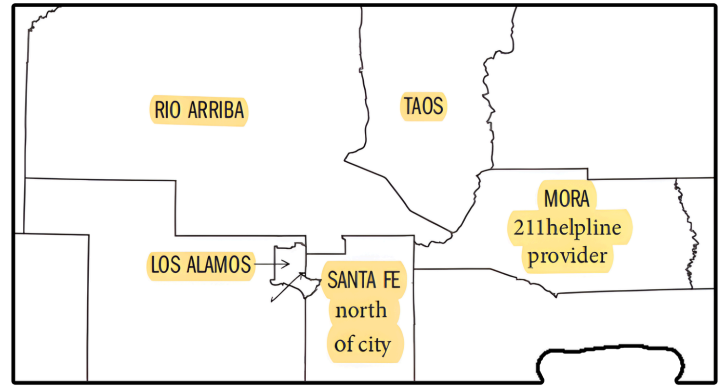

Taos

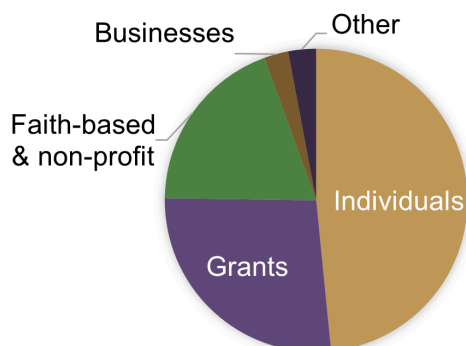
When a young couple with two children faced income loss and additional costs due to a child's out-of-town medical treatment, we prevented a water shutoff and secured electric bill support from a partner.
